A changing table is available in the all-gender/family bathroom and also in the nursery.
- ❖ **We LOVE kids in worship!** Should you need to step away, there is plenty of room to enjoy in the Fellowship Hall. Our nursery will return in the fall.
- ❖ **Bulletins can be recycled** in the bins in the narthex with the Green Recycle Labels.
